URGENT CALL OUT FOR AN ASSISTANT SECRETARY


Frank our secretary will soon be away overseas for an extended period.







OUR NIGHT AT THE THEATRE

THE DICTIONARY OF LOST WORDS

Our first QPAC group theatre booking was a great success. Balcony seats in the centre section of Rows A & B gave us a first class overview of the stage. The sets and staging were superbly crafted.

Across the back of the stage a wall of pigeon holes that represented the scriptorium morphed into doorways and windows. It supported an upper stage that represented the maid's bedroom, the river bank and the battlefields of France. Images from an overhead projector filled the obscure gaps in time and location. The imagination did the rest.

On the main stage, the actors, many who played multiple roles, transported us on a journey from A-B at the "scrippy" in Oxford 1881 where the first Oxford Dictionary was being complied, to 1899 in Adelaide, where the childhood misdemeanours of Esme from a century previously had found a loving home.

"The Dictionary of Lost Words" is a love story on many levels. The love of family and the love of words are deliciously intertwined against the backdrop of Victorian society, gender roles and morals.

Even for those who had not read the book found the Dictionary of Lost Words a very enjoyable night at the theatre.
